monitor the district's use of the authority granted under this section and shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over utilities matters no later than January 15, 2008 on its findings and recommendations regarding continuation of this authority. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over utilities matters may report out a bill on the subject matter of this section to the Second Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature.

**Sec. 9. Emergency clause; referendum; effective date.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Town of Winterport voting at a special election called and held within 2 years after passage of this Act. The election must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections, except that the municipal officers are not required to prepare or the town clerk to post a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of voters, the registrar is required to be in session the 3 secular days next preceding the election, of which the first 2 days must be devoted to registration of the voters and the last day to verification of the list and completion of the records of these sessions. The subject matter of this Act is reduced to the following question:

“Do you favor the dissolution of the Winterport Sewerage District and the acquisition of the assets and liabilities of the Winterport Sewerage District by the Winterport Water District?”

This Act takes effect for all purposes immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters of Winterport voting at the election.

The results of the election must be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Winterport and due certificate of the results filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.

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**CHAPTER 51**

**S.P. 842 - L.D. 2100**

**An Act To Amend the Charter of the Anson Water District**

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

**Sec. 1. P&SL 1915, c. 200, §1** is amended to read:

**Sec. 1. Anson Water District created; purposes; territory.** The following described

territory and the ~~people inhabitants~~ within the same shall constitute a body politic and corporate under the name of the Anson Water District, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said ~~the~~ district with pure water for domestic, sanitary and municipal purposes, to wit: So much of the ~~town~~ Town of Anson, in Somerset ~~county~~ County, ~~as is bounded on the north by the north line of said town; on the east by the Kennebec river; on the south by the south line of said town; on the west by a straight line extending southerly, but not exactly south, from the point where the west line of the Great Embden pond road intersects the north line of said town to a point where the east line of Otis M. Hilton's farm in said Anson intersects the south line of said town. as is described as follows:~~

Starting at the intersection of New Portland Road and the Anson town line bordering the Town of Embden; thence in a south-easterly direction along New Portland Road to a point 69°55'12.66"W, 44°52'27.82"N; thence in a southwesterly direction to a point 69°55'27.95"W, 44°49'7.33"N; thence in a southerly direction to the intersection of Pease Hill Road and West Mills Road; thence in a southwesterly direction along West Mills Road to the intersection of West Mills Road and Mayhew Road; thence in a southerly direction along Mayhew Road to the intersection of Mayhew Road and the Anson town line bordering the Town of Starks; thence in a northeasterly direction along the Anson town line to the border of the Town of Madison; thence in a northerly direction along the Anson town line bordering the Town of Madison to the corner of the Anson town line bordering the Town of Embden and the Town of Solon; thence in a southwesterly direction along the Anson town line to the starting point.

**Sec. 2. P&SL 1915, c. 200, §2-A** is enacted to read:

**Sec. 2-A. Power to take water.** The district is authorized to take, to hold and to convey within the Town of Anson and from any part of the town water from any groundwater source within the town.

**Sec. 3. P&SL 1915, c. 200, §6, 3rd sentence** is amended to read:

The annual meeting for the election of officers shall be in the month of July trustees is at the district's annual meeting.
