CHAPTER 58

H.P. 405 - L.D. 550

An Act To Appropriate Matching Funds for the Construction of a Community Center in Oxford Hills

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

AGRICULTURE, FOOD AND RURAL RESOURCES, DEPARTMENT OF

Office of the Commissioner 0401

Initiative: Provides one-time funds to match private funds of at least an equal amount to provide a grant to the Oxford County Agricultural Society to support the construction of a community center for agricultural and cultural purposes on land owned by the association.

CHAPTER 59

H.P. 131 - L.D. 180

An Act To Appropriate State Funds To Protect Potato Farmland in Aroostook County from Blight and Other Diseases That Could Occur with the 2004 Crop Unless Cull Potatoes Are Dumped Properly

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Potato Board 0429

Initiative: Appropriates funds to assist farmers who are in need of assistance with disposal of table stock potatoes that are rotting due to poor weather during the harvest in 2004.

CHAPTER 60

S.P. 679 - L.D. 1762

An Act Authorizing the Deorganization of Drew Plantation

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Deorganization of Drew Plantation. Drew Plantation in Penobscot County is deorganized, except that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of the plantation survive for the purposes of prosecuting and defending all pending suits to which the plantation is, or may be, a party and all needful process arising out of any suits, including provisions for the payment of all or any judgments or debts that may be rendered against the plantation or exist in favor of any creditor.

Sec. 2. Deorganization Plan. The deorganization of Drew Plantation must be in accordance with the Deorganization Plan as amended February 1, 2006.

Sec. 3. Unexpended school funds. The treasurer of Drew Plantation or any other person who has custody of the funds of the plantation shall pay to the Treasurer of State all unexpended school funds that, together with the credits due the plantation for school purposes, are to be used by the State Tax Assessor to settle any school obligations contracted by the plantation before deorganization. Any unexpended school funds remaining with the Treasurer of State after all the obligations have been met must be added to the Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund, as established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 115.

Sec. 4. Provision of education services. Notwithstanding any other law, this section entitles all prekindergarten to grade 5 pupils in Drew Plantation to attend school in Kingman Township, all grade 6 to grade 8 pupils to attend school within Maine School Administrative District No. 30 and all grade 9 to grade 12 pupils to attend school at Lee Academy. Pupils must be provided transportation at state expense to those schools.

Sec. 5. Assessment of taxes. The State Tax Assessor shall assess the real and personal property taxes in Drew Plantation as of April 1, 2007, as
