CHAPTER 7

H.P. 340 - L.D. 465

**Resolve, Regarding Legislative
Review of Chapter 125: Calendar
Adoption, a Major Substantive Rule
of the Department of Education**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A requires legislative authorization before major substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by the agency; and

Whereas, the above-named major substantive rule has been submitted to the Legislature for review; and

Whereas, immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved: That final adoption of Chapter 125: Calendar Adoption, a provisionally adopted major substantive rule of the Department of Education that has been submitted to the Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, is authorized.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

CHAPTER 8

S.P. 498 - L.D. 1456

**Resolve, Directing the Department of
Inland Fisheries and Wildlife To
Increase Turkey Hunting
Opportunities**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife has adopted rules to establish an open turkey hunting season, without a lottery system of limited entry, beginning in 2006; and

Whereas, this legislation authorizes opening the 2005 spring turkey season to all qualified applicants, without a lottery system of limited entry; and

Whereas, this legislation must take effect prior to the beginning of this year's spring turkey season, scheduled to begin in May; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Authorized permits for all applicants. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any lottery system of limited entry in effect at the time of application, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall provide turkey hunting permits to all qualified persons who submitted timely applications for permits for the 2005 spring turkey hunting season.

Nothing in this resolve may be construed to prohibit a system of alternate weeks of seasons within the open turkey hunting season; and be it further

Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.
