LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
June 9, 1981

CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Legislative Council was held in the Legislative Council Chambers, Room 327, and called to order by Chairman Elizabeth Mitchell at 2:00 p.m.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

MOTION

Rep. Martin moved that the minutes of June 4, 1981 be accepted.

The motion was seconded by Sen. Pierce and carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

A letter from the Committee on Education requesting that 4 work sessions be held on L.D. 1554 during the interim so that the amended bill will be ready for the beginning of the second session.

MOTION

Rep. Martin moved that the request be granted.

Rep. Diamond seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

A letter from the Department of Finance and Administration as required by Title 5, section 8-F was submitted to the Council.

The Committee on State Government's study request of "Family Housing Policy" was brought before the Council for reconsideration.

Rep. Diamond seconded the motion and it was carried with 2 opposed.

NEW BUSINESS

Sen. Sutton submitted an After Deadline Request "AN ACT to Clarify Exceptions Relating to Security Interests in Residence in Bankruptcy Cases" to the Council for approval.

MOTION

Rep. Martin moved that the request be approved.

Rep. Tarbell seconded the motion and it was voted upon with all members present voting yea except Sen. Pray who voted nay. The request was accepted.

An After Deadline Request from Rep. Sherburne "AN ACT to Establish Temporary Minimum Prices to be Paid to Milk Dealers and Retailers and to Facilitate Compliance of the Milk Commission with Recent Cases before the Maine Courts" was submitted to the Council for approval.

MOTION

Rep. Martin moved that the request be approved.

Sen. Collins seconded the motion and it was voted upon with all members present voting yea except Sen. Conley who voted nay. The request was accepted.
