LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
February 9, 1983

CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Legislative Council was held in the Legislative Council Chambers, Room 327 and called to order by Chairman Charles P. Pray at 1:35 p.m.

LEGISLATIVE OFFICERS AND STAFF REPORTS

Sarah Diamond, Legislative Administrative Director, submitted a letter to the Council concerning future acquisition of data and word processing methods for the Legislature and recommending that a subcommittee of the Council be formed to study the needs and options available.
