The Joint Standing Committee on Business and Commerce hereby requests permission to carry over LD 1651, An Act Relating to Shares of Stock of the Asti-Kim Corporation, to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.


This bill requesting emergency action was presented only a week before the close of the legislative session. The Committee needs additional time to consider the possible effects of this proposal on the rights of the company's shareholders.

Currently, the position of the Model Business Corporation Act and all 50 states is that a corporation should not be allowed to vote treasury shares because by so doing, corporate management could dilute the control of the company's shareholders.
