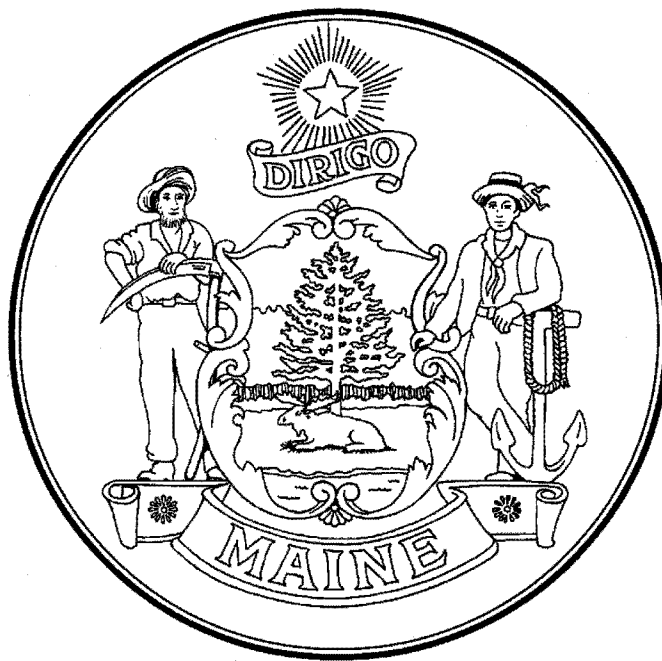

The Chair, Speaker Mitchell, called the Council to order at 3:20 p.m.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Sally Tubbesing, Executive Director, drew members' attention to a copy of a Report that summarizes the status of bills by committee and noted that it was originally developed to help staff Directors and members of leadership plan session schedules and spot logjams in committee.

Item #1: Legislature's "Part I" Budget: Presentation to Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations & Financial Affairs

Motion: That the item be tabled. (Motion by President Lawrence; second by Rep. Kontos; unanimous).

NEW BUSINESS

Item #1: Implementation of Collective Bargaining Agreement for Legislative Employees

The Chair, Speaker Mitchell, recognized Senate President Lawrence, who, after distributing copies of a motion, proceeded to read it:

Motion: That the Legislative Council authorize the provision of salary increases for legislative employees, the Constitutional Officers and State Auditor, consistent with those increases awarded to employees covered by collective bargaining agreements and other state employees who are unclassified as follows:

- A 2 1/4% lump sum payment to all employees except the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council, the Constitutional Officers and the State Auditor, consistent with the provisions of the collective bargaining agreement;

- A 2% adjustment in all salary schedules within the jurisdiction of the Legislative Council effective at the beginning of the pay week in which July 1, 1997 falls consistent with the terms of the collective bargaining agreement; and
- A 2% adjustment in all salary schedules within the jurisdiction of the Legislative Council effective at the beginning of the pay week in which July 1, 1998 falls consistent with the terms of the collective bargaining agreement.

(Motion by Senate President Lawrence; second by Sen. Rand).

Discussion Council members raised several questions, which are summarized here, along with the responses that were provided in the course of the discussion.

- When would the 2 1/4% lump sum payment be paid? (Sen. Kieffer)

Senate President Lawrence responded that the pending legislation contained a provision that this payment be issued within 30 days of the signing of the legislation by the Governor.

- What would be the total cost of implementation to Legislative employees? (Sen. Amero).

Ms. Tubbesing drew members' attention to the information that had been distributed and noted that the bill includes an appropriation to the Salary Fund to cover the cost of the agreement.

- Whether the legislation has been signed. (Sen. Kieffer).

The Chair, Speaker Mitchell, noted that it had been scheduled for public hearing the following Monday.

- Whether the Council's approval of the motion is premature, given the fact that the legislation is still pending. (Sen. Kieffer).

Speaker Mitchell pointed out that the motion is worded so that it would be void unless the pending legislation was enacted.

The vote was taken, and the motion was approved 6-3.

Item #2: After Deadline Requests

After deadline requests were considered by the Legislative Council. The Council's action on these requests is included on the attached list.

RECESS

Motion: That the Council stand in recess pending the receipt of additional material. (Motion by Sen. Lawrence; second by Sen. Rand).

The Council meeting was recessed at 3:30 p.m.

RECONVENE

The Chair, Speaker Mitchell, reconvened the Council at 3:45 p.m. The Chair returned to the Tabled Item under **Old Business:**

Item #1: Legislature's Part I Budget: Presentation to Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations & Financial Affairs

The Chair, Speaker Mitchell, stated the Council was scheduled to testify before the Appropriations Committee on the Legislature's Part I Budget Request the following day; thus, it would be necessary for the Council to take a formal position on the request. She then recognized Sen. Amero, who presented recommended reductions in the Legislature's 1998 - 1999 Part I request on behalf of her party's colleagues on the Council.

Motion: That the Majority Report, including the recommendation to fully fund the Law and Legislative Reference Library, be accepted. (Motion by Senate President Lawrence; second by Rep. Kontos; approved 6-4).

Note: Copies of both the majority and minority recommendations are attached to these minutes.
