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
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PART 1

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INTRODUCTION

This volume contains the bill requests submitted by Legislators before cloture on September 30, 2011 that are proposed for introduction in the Second Regular Session of the 125th Legislature. The requests are listed in Part 2 and are arranged by subject matter. Each request is indicated by a title, followed by a short summary of the bill request and, where applicable, cross-references to other requests that appear to be related. We have also identified requests that may be precluded by Joint Rule 217 with cross-references to the possible conflicting LDs from last session.



The graph above shows categories of bill requests for this session and the past three second regular sessions.

Two years ago, in 2009, out of a total of 374 precloture legislator requests to review, 130 were admitted at the initial screening and 32 at the appeal screening for a total of 162 legislator bills accepted.

Four years ago, in 2007, out of a total of 566 precloture legislator requests to review, 148 were admitted at the initial screening and 46 at the appeal screening for a total of 194 legislator bills accepted.

Six years ago, in 2005, out of a total of 496 precloture legislator requests to review, 174 were admitted at the initial screening and 37 at the appeal screening for a total of 211 legislator bills accepted.

This year a total of 57 agency and independent bills were filed, as compared to 75 in 2009, 47 in 2007 and 64 in 2005.

Additionally, the workload of the Legislature includes 131 carryovers for the upcoming session, as compared to 88 in 2009, 169 in 2007 and 233 in 2005.

Comments: This bill would require testing of well water used at licensed child care facilities for arsenic and cadmium.

Title: An Act To Establish a Board of Dental Hygienists

Comments: Currently, dental hygienists are regulated under the Board of Dental Examiners, which oversees dentists and other dental professions. This bill would establish a separate Board of Dental Hygienists.

LR: 2363

Title: An Act To Withdraw the State from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative

Comments: Current law requires the State to withdraw from the regional greenhouse gas initiative if other participating states have a total carbon dioxide emissions budget totaling less than 35,000 tons. This bill would eliminate this condition for withdrawal, and instead require the State simply to withdraw from the regional greenhouse gas initiative.

- Title: An Act To Amend the Laws Pertaining to High-stakes Beano Conducted by the Passamaquoddy Tribe
- Comments: This bill would eliminate the provision in the law that limits an organization licensed to operate high-stakes beano games to operation of those games on 27 weekends a year. It also would allow the Passamaquoddy Tribe to operate electronic beano.

Title: An Act To Require That Federally Recognized Indian Tribes in Maine Be Included in a Single Legislative District

Comments: This bill would require that federally recognized Indian tribes in Maine be included in a single legislative district. This legislative district may include nontribal members.

Title: An Act To Return to the Passamaquoddy Tribe the Tax on Sales Occurring on Land Held in Trust by the Passamaquoddy Tribe

Comments: This bill would require the Treasurer of State to return to the Passamaquoddy Tribe any tax collected on sales on land held in trust by the tribe.

Title: An Act To Impose a Penalty for Making False Claims Regarding Affiliation with a Federally Recognized Tribe

Comments: This bill would make it a crime to falsely claim affiliation with a federally recognized tribe in order to obtain services to which a member of a federally recognized tribe is entitled.

Title: An Act To Clarify the Laws Governing School Enrollment for Children Who Are Placed in Foster Homes by Indian Child Welfare Agencies

Comments: This bill would specifically authorize children who are placed outside the reservation by Indian Child Welfare agencies to attend school where the foster family resides.

- Title: Resolve, Authorizing the Department of Health and Human Services To Develop an Alternative Method of Calculating Minimum Staffing Levels in Nursing Homes
- Comments: This resolve would authorize the Department of Health and Human Services to develop an alternative method of calculating minimum staffing levels in nursing homes.

LR: 2580

Title: An Act To Allow for the Timely Access to and Enhanced Administration of Injectable Medications, Biologicals, Immunizations and Vaccines

Comments: This bill would amend the law listing the named drugs and immunizations that pharmacists may administer to enable authorized pharmacists to administer any federally approved drug, immunization or vaccine as well as any allergy or other injectable biological. It would also change the minimum age for administration for all such medications to allow administration to a person 12 years of age or older and would reduce the minimum age for administration of influenza vaccines and intranasal influenza vaccines to 5 years. It would also enable an authorized pharmacist to hold an off-site clinic to administer all such medications without requiring the prior consent of the Maine Board of Pharmacy as long as the pharmacist or drug outlet has obtained prior approval of its plan of operation for operating the off-site clinic.

Comments: This bill would require that authorities be notified within 48 hours after a child is missing and notified within 2 hours of a child's death.
