President Jackson called the December 21, 2023 meeting of the 131<sup>st</sup> Legislative Council to order at 1:15 p.m. in the Legislative Council Chamber.

## Item #2: Acceptance of the Annual Report of the Loring Development Authority of Maine

The Loring Development Authority of Maine submitted its annual report for acceptance by the Legislative Council.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Item #1: Funding of dues shortfalls for the National Conference of State
Legislatures (NCSL) and the Council of State Governments (CSG) in State
fiscal years 2024

The Council discussed funding the dues shortfalls for NCSL and CSG in State fiscal years 2024, and expressed interest in hearing additional information regarding funding from the Executive Director on the issue. **Motion:** That the Legislative Council table the proposed funding of the dues shortfalls for NCSL and CSG in State fiscal years 2024. Motion by Representative Terry. Second by Speaker Talbot Ross. **Motion passed unanimously (8-0-0-2, with Senator Daughtry and Senator Keim absent).** 

Item #2: Request to authorize transfer of funds from the Reserve Fund for State House Preservation & Maintenance to the Blaine House Renovation & Repairs Fund

Elaine Clark, Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, presented Commissioner Kirsten Figueroa's request to the Legislative Council to transfer \$100,000 from the Reserve Fund for State House Preservation & Maintenance to the Blaine House Renovation & Repairs Fund, and described to the Council the types of projects for which the requested funds would be used. **Motion:** That the Legislative Council authorize the transfer of \$100,000 in fiscal year 2024 from the State House Preservation & Maintenance Fund to the Blaine House Renovation & Repairs Fund to address one-time needs at the Blaine House. Motion by President Jackson. Second by Speaker Talbot Ross. **Motion passed unanimously (8-0-0-2, with Senator Daughtry and Senator Keim absent).** 

Item #3: Request from the Maine District of the National Speech and Debate Association to hold the 2024 Dale Denno Memorial NSDA Qualifying Tournament in the State House

The Council reviewed the request from the Maine District of the National Speech and Debate Association to hold the annual High School Debate Qualifying Tournament in the State House in January. **Motion:** That the Legislative Council authorize the District of the National Speech and Debate Association to hold the

2024 Dale Denno Memorial NSDA Qualifying Tournament in the State House on Saturday, January 27, 2024. Motion by Senator Vitelli. Second by Representative Terry. Motion passed unanimously (8-0-0-2, with Senator Daughtry and Senator Keim absent).

## Item #4: Request from the YMCA Youth and Government Program to Hold the 2024 Youth and Government Program in the State House Complex

The Council reviewed the request from the YMCA Youth and Government Program to Hold the 2024 Youth and Government Program in the State House Complex over the Veterans Day weekend in 2024. **Motion:** That the Legislative Council authorize the YMCA Youth and Government Program to Hold the 2024 Youth and Government Program in the State House Complex on November 8-10, 2024. Motion by Representative Terry. Second by Representative Cloutier. **Motion passed unanimously (8-0-0-2, with Senator Daughtry and Senator Keim absent).** 

#### Item #5: Request to Commission Portraits of Former United States Senators Olympia Snowe and William Cohen

The Council reviewed the request from former Senate President Kevin Raye for the Council to authorize the commissioning of official portraits of former U.S. Senators Olympia Snowe and William Cohen for display in the State House. Speaker Talbot Ross inquired about the making of decisions about whose portraits are commissioned and hung in the State House. Executive Director Gresser responded that the Legislative Council Policy on the Maine State House Portrait Collection outlines both how portraits are commissioned and how determinations about placement in the State House are made. Speaker Talbot Ross expressed interest in involving the Secretary of State, and suggested that the Maine State Museum, which holds title to the portraits, forward a list of the contents of the State House Portrait Collection to both the Secretary of State and the State House Facilities Committee. **Motion:** That the request to commission portraits of former U.S. Senators Olympia Snowe and William Cohen be referred to the State House Facilities Committee Meeting for review and recommendation to the full Legislative Council; and further, that the Maine State Museum be requested to forward to both the State House Facilities Committee and the Maine Secretary of State a list of the holdings in the Maine State House Portrait Collection; and further, that the State House Facilities Committee review those portions of the Legislative Council Policy on the Maine State House Portrait Collection that outline how portraits are commissioned and decisions are made regarding which portraits are hung in the State House. Motion by Speaker Talbot Ross. Second by Representative Terry. Motion passed unanimously (8-0-0-2, with Senator Daughtry and Senator Keim absent).

President Jackson suggested moving the January Legislative Council meeting, originally scheduled for January 18, 2024, in order to take up after-deadline bill
