Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Victor P. Musk of Augusta.

Mr. PARKER of Piscataquis: Mr. President, the only reason I am rising is that I am afraid a great many of us who would vote are a bit confused as to just how we should vote if we are opposed to this bill. I would suggest that the President or Secretary explain in detail just how we should vote in order to vote correctly.

The PRESIDENT: This measure was indefinitely postponed in the House yesterday. The motion made by the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Marden, is to recede and concur with the House in indefinite postponement. If you vote in the affirmative, the bill will be indefinitely postponed.

Thereupon, a division of the Senate was had.

Seventeen having voted in the affirmative and fourteen opposed,

the motion prevailed and the Senate voted to recede and concur.
