Mr. CYR: Mr. President, when this item went through probably most of the Senators, knowing my feeling on this particular item, were probably wondering why I did not get up and say anything in regard to it. It would seem rather ironical, after everything you have heard me say around the State House here in regard to this particular project, that now I would rise and support that same bill.

The bill calls for an expenditure of \$700 to document this great survey, and certainly I would not want to be the one to stop this project of having this particular survey document so that it can take its place with all the other great documents in our permanent archives with all of the great surveys of the past. In fact, who knows what history may have in store for this great survey? Some day some august body may decide in their wisdom that after a very tiresome day possibly they would fishing somewhere go to where there is no Desolation Pond, and the Councilman from the 7th District may take out his \$15,000 road map and tell the other members of this august body, "We have in my district a great wildernessin fact it is known as the last wilderness east of the Mississippiwhere everything is wild including the caravans that go through it.

So, for those reasons, I would say that it is false economy on my part to try to prevent this great survey from taking its place in history. Thank you very much.

On motion by Mr. Cole of Waldo, the Senate voted to take from the table the 16th tabled and unassigned item (H. P. 465) (L. D. 665) House Report, Ought to Pass as amended by Committee Amendment A, from the Committee on Claims on Resolve in Favor of Richard S. Foster of York; and on further motion by the same Sesator, the Ought to pass report was accepted, the bill read once, Committee Amendment A read and

adopted, and the bill was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Noyes of Franklin, the Senate voted to take from the table Item 6-29, S. P. 495, L. D. 1492 bill, "An Act Prohibiting Sale of Alcoholic Beverages in the Unorganized Territory" tabled by that Senator earlier in today's session pending acceptance of the report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report was accepted, the bill read once and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Edgar of Hancock, the Senate voted to take from the table Senate Report "Ought to pass", New Draft, New Title from the Committee on Highways on Bill, "An Act Relating to Area Directional Signs for Sanford," (S. P. 343) (L. D. 1076) reporting that the same Ought to Pass in New Draft, Under a New Title. "An Act Relating to Area Directional Signs for Sanford and Rangeley Areas' (S. P. 494) (L. D. 1489) which was tabled earlier in today's session by that Senator pending assignment for reading, and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was tomorrow assigned for second reading.
