SENATE

Thursday, April 13, 1961

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Alice T. Hart of Hallowell.

On motion by Mr. Parker of Piscataquis,

Journal of yesterday was read and approved.

Papers from the House Non-Concurrent

Bill, "An Act Relating to Chiropractic Treatment Under Workmen's Compensation Law." (S. P. 325) (L. D. 1000)

In Senate, March 24, indefinitely postponed.

Comes from the House, passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A" (Filing S-48) in non-concurrence.

(In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Farris of Kennebec, tabled pending consideration.)

Bill, "An Act Relating to the Inspection of County Jails." (S. P. 504) (L. D. 1518)

In Senate, April 4, passed to be engrossed.

Comes from the House, passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "A" in non-concurrence. (Filing H-177)

(In the Senate, on motion by Mrs. Lord of Cumberland, tabled pending consideration and especially assigned for Tuesday next.)

House Adhered

Bill, "An Act to Incorporate the Domestic Finance Corporation of Kennebunk." (H. P. 729) (L. D. 1017)

In House, March 14, indefinitely postponed.

In Senate, April 11, passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A", in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, April 12, that body having adhered to its former action.

(In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Noyes of Franklin, tabled pending consideration."

Bill, "An Act Relating to Private Shooting Preserves." (H. P. 985) (L. D. 1372)

In House, April 7, Majority Ought Not to pass Report accepted.

In Senate, April 11, recommitted to Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, April 12, that body having adhered to its former action.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Stilphen of Knox, the Senate voted to recede and concur.

Bill, "An Act Increasing Tax on Milk Producers for Promotional Purposes." (H. P. 866) (L. D. 1201)

In House, April 5, indefinitely postponed.

In Senate, April 11, the Bill passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, April 12, that body having adhered to its former action.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Parker of Piscataquis the Senate voted to insist on its former action and ask for a Committee of Conference. The President appointed as Senate members of said Committee, Senators: Parker of Piscataquis, Pike of Oxford and Erwin of York.

On motion by Mr. Stilphen of Knox,

ORDERED, the House concurring that H. P. 487, L. D. 687 Resolve Regulating Fishing in Certain Waters of Aroostook County, be recalled from the legislative files to the Senate.

Which was read and passed.
