SENATE

In Senate, January 26, 1965 Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Preston W. Pennell of Winthrop.

On motion by Mr. Casey of Washington.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

At this point, Senator Harding of Aroostook assumed the Chair. President Reed retiring to the floor of the Senate.

Thereupon, Mr. Reed of Sagadahoc presented the following Resolution and moved its adoption

The PRESIDENT pro tem: The Secretary will read the Resolution and the Chair requests the members of the Senate to stand during the reading.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the members of the 102nd Legislature have learned with great sorrow of the sudden death of former Governor, Hon. Sumner Sewall, Governor of Maine from 1941 to 1945, and

WHEREAS Sumner Sewall will always be remembered by his contemporaries as one of the most colorful, vigorous, friendly and effective leaders Maine was ever privileged to have as a Governor, and

WHEREAS History will record him as an outstanding hero in the beginning of air warfare in World War I and in many other capacities as a builder of the hopedfor permanent peace, and

WHEREAS Maine historians will accord his record with a fitting place in its annals as a member of a famous family of shipbuilders who are a part of the foundation of this State and credit him with having built well on this firm foundation, and

WHEREAS the members of this 102nd Legislature who have had the honor of serving with him feel a very personal loss in his passing and recall the days when the Sewall family were in the Blaine House as some of the happiest years of public service,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RE-SOLVED that the State of Maine mourns the loss of a beloved and valued leader, and the members of the 102nd Legislature lament the passing of one of Maine's outstanding citizens, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED

that a copy of these resolutions be sent to his family.
