State of Maine 102nd Legislature

Joint Resolution

WHEREAS, the Town of Lisbon was dealt a severe economic blow, through the closure of its two mills:

WHEREAS, a loss of over nine hundred employment opportunities ensued;

WHEREAS, the Town of Lisbon was not in a position of self aid due to lack of resources and technical knowledge;

WHEREAS, a Presidential Task Force was assigned to the Town of Lisbon in which Col. Iverson Mitchell, in a spirit of true dedication, united a local force and worked unwaveringly until the objective was clear;

IT HEREBY RESOLVED BE that this 102nd Maine Legislature go on record to declare its recognition to Federal, State and local agencies which contributed, and were instrumental in restoring a favorable economic climate to the Town of Lisbon as recognized and defined below:

President Lyndon B. Johnson; The Presidential Task Force, under the direction of Col. Iverson Mitchell, and assisted by Mr. Jerome Barnett; The Small Business Administration, headed by Mr. Thomas Noonan; The U. S. Department of Agriculture; The Members of Maine Congressional Delegation; John H. Reed, Governor of the State of Maine; The Department of Economic Development, headed by Commissioner Standish K. Bachman and assisted by Mr. Robert Ransone; and The Maine Employment Security Commission

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Joint Resolution be transmitted by the Clerk of the House to the Secretary of Commerce, and heads of other assisting agencies, with the request that they accept this commenda-tion with the sincere gratitude of the Town of Lisbon and the 102nd

Mr. O'LEARY of Oxford: Mr. President, I have many misgivings about this act and I would like to request that it be referred to the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game.

The President laid before the Senate the 5th tabled and today assigned matter (S. P. 90) (L. D. 234) Bill, "An Act to Correct Errors and Inconsistencies in the Education Laws," which was tabled by that Senator on February 10 pending Adoption of Senate Amendment "A".

Mr. O'LEARY: Mr. President, in regard to this Senate Amendment, Filing S-6, I have many misgivings about this amendment and I would question the germaneness of this amendment to Bill, "An Act to Correct Errors and Inconsistencies in the Education Laws."

The PRESIDENT: Does the Chair understand the Senator to question the germaneness of the amendment?

Mr. O'LEARY: I do, Mr. President.

The PRESIDENT: The Senate may be at ease.

(At ease)

Called to order by the President. The PRESIDENT: The Chair rules that the amendment is germane.

Mr. O'LEARY: Mr. President, I was wishing that the Chair would rule that the amendment was not germane so I would not have the unpleasant task of standing here asking for the indefinite postponement of this amendment, but I shall now make a short statement as to what I believe is in the area of its ungermaneness to this bill.

At the end of the amendment it says: "Busses operated by a motor carrier having a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by the Public Utilities Commission under Title 35, Sections 1501 to 1518 which comply with the requirements of the Commission shall not be regarded as school busses."

I believe this should not be under this one section but should belong under another, regulated by the Public Utilities, so I therefore ask that this amendment be indefinitely postponed.

The PRESIDENT: Does the Chair understand the Senator's motion to be to indefinitely postpone, or is the Senator questioning the ruling of the Chair which is his prerogative?

Mr. O'LEARY of Oxford: Mr. President, I move the indefinite postponement of Senate A m e n dment A.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Snow of Cumberland, the bill and accompanying papers were tabled pending motion by Mr. O'Leary of Oxford to indefinitely postpone Senate Amendment A.

Mrs. SPROUL of Lincoln: Mr. President, I move that the Senate reconsider its action taken on Item 7-3, L. D. 58.

The motion prevailed and the Senate voted to reconsider its action taken earlier in today's session whereby Bill, "An Act Relating to Attending Secondary School Outside of Residence" (H. P. 46) (L. D. 58) was passed to be engrossed.

Mrs. SPROUL of Lincoln: Mr. President, I would like some member of the Education Committee to explain to me just what this bill does. If it does what I think it does, I strenuously object.

The PRESIDENT: The Senator from Lincoln, Senator Sproul requests a member of the Education Committee to explain to her what this bill does. Any member of the Committee who wishes may answer.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Snow of Cumberland, the bill was tabled pending passage to be engrossed.

Mr. CAHILL of Somerset: Mr. President, as many of you know, I tabled this for the purpose of offering an amendment. While everyone was very sympathetic, no one seemed to think he would vote for it anyway so I shall bow to the will of the committee.
