SENATE

Tuesday, March 2, 1965

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Clifford Patnode of Gardiner.

On motion by Mr. Moore of Washington, the Journal of Friday was read and approved.

Order Out of Order

Mr. Harding of Aroostook presented the following Order out of order and under suspension of the rules moved its passage:

ORDERED, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives proposing a Convention of both branches of the Legislature, to be held at ten-thirty A.M. today in the Hall of the House for the purpose of extending to His Excellency Governor John H. Reed an invitation to extend whatever remarks he deems advisable.

Read and passed and sent forthwith to the House.

The PRESIDENT: The Secretary will deliver the message and the Senate will be at ease awaiting his return.

Secretary Pert subsequently reported that he had delivered the message with which he was charged.

At this point Clerk of the House Plante entered the Senate Chamber and reported that the House would be delighted and pleased to concur with meeting in a Joint Convention.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair at this time would like to recognize in the Senate Chambers representatives of the League of Women Voters of Maine, with Mrs. George Healy, their Legislative Chairman and Mrs. Charles McEvoy, their President. They are representatives from the local leagues in Auburn, Bangor, Brunswick, Falmouth, Kittery, Lewiston, Mt. Desert, Orono, Portland, Rockland, South Portland and Waterville.

We welcome you here this morning and hope that you enjoy and benefit from your stay here. (Applause)
