Friday, May 14, 1965

Senate called to order by the President.

Mr. HARDING of Aroostook: Mr. President, I would inquire if the Senate is in possession of L. D. 394, Resolve Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Lower the Voting Age to Eighteen Years?

The PRESIDENT: The Chair would state that it is, having been requested by the President.

Thereupon, on further motion by the same Senator, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed; and to further reconsider its action whereby Senate Amendment "B" was adopted.

The same Senator then presented Senate Amendment "A" to Senate Amendment "B" and moved its

adoption.

Which amendment (S-206) was read and adopted, Senate Amendment "B" as amended by Senate Amendment "A" was read and adopted and the bill as amended was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Manuel of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table the 22nd tabled and unassigned item (H. P. 1029) (L. D. 1399). House Reports from the Committee on Highways on Bill, "An Act Providing Funds for Land Damages and Rights of Way for Maine Quebec Highway"; Majority Report, Ought not to pass; Minority Report, Ought to pass; tabled on April 21 by Senator Manuel of Aroostook pending acceptance of either report.

Mr. MANUEL of Aroostook: Mr. President, I now move acceptance of the Ought to pass report of the

committee.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Glass of Waldo, the bill was tabled

pending the motion of Senator Manuel of Aroostook to accept the Minority Ought to pass report.

On motion by Mrs. Sproul of Lincoln, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action taken earlier in today's session whereby it passed to be engrossed, Item 3 (previously tabled and especially assigned for today) (S. P. 335) (L. D. 1080) Bill, "An Act Relating to Tuition for Students Attending Secondary School Outside of Residence."

Mrs. SPROUL of Lincoln: Mr. President, I have been having a little difficulty studying this bill and I wish someone on the Education Committee would explain what it does.

The PRESIDENT: The Senator from Lincoln, Senator Sproul directs a question to any member of the Education Committee who may answer if they so choose.

Mr. SNOW of Cumberland: Mr. President, the bill is a very complicated revision of the subsidy formula. I would like to suggest and I would hope that some Senator would table the bill. I think that this could be best explained to the Senator in a private conversation. It is a very complicated subject.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Hoffses of Knox, the bill was tabled pending passage to be engrossed and especially assigned for Wednesday next.

On motion by Mr. Duquette of York, the Senate voted to take from the Special Appropriations table, (H. P. 88) (L. D. 97), Bill, "An Act Increasing Retirement Benefits under State Retirement System; and on motion by Mr. Harding of Aroostook, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed; and the same Senator presented Senate Amendment "A" and moved its adoption.

Which amendment (S-208) was read and adopted, and the bill as amended was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Harding of Aroostook, the Senate voted to take from the table the 29th tabled and unassigned item (H. P. 32) (L. D. 44) Bill, "An Act Relating to Establishment and Operation of Regional Technical and Vocational Centers"; tabled on April 28 by Senator Harding of Aroostook pending enactment; and on further motion by the same Senator, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed. The same Senator presented Senate Amendment "A" and moved its adoption.

D. 767) Bill, "An Act Providing for a New Charter for the City of Lewiston"; tabled on May 4 by Senator Jacques of Androscoggin pending passage to be engrossed; and that Senator presented Senate Amendment "A" and moved its adoption.

Which amendment was read, and on motion by Mr. Jacques, the bill was tabled pending his motion to adopt Senate Amendment "A".

On motion by Mr. Maxwell of Franklin, the Senate voted to take from the table the 26th tabled and unassigned item (H. P. 102) (L. D. 110) House Report, Ought not to pass, from the Committee on Taxation on bill, "An Act Relating to Sweepstake Races and Allocating Proceeds for Educational Purposes"; tabled on April 23 by Senator Maxwell of Franklin pending acceptance of the report and that Senator moved the pending question.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Faloor of Penobscot, the bill was tabled pending the motion by Mr. Maxwell of Franklin to accept the Ought not to pass report.
