# Orders of the Day

Mr. Harding of Aroostook was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate.

Mr. HARDING: Mr. President, of course I need not remind any

of you that this is a Special Session and we are trying to do the work here as expeditiously as possible. We are not suggesting, however, that anyone rush through any of their work on committees, but in order to complete the task which we have it is very essential that committee chairmen and all members of the committee have executive sessions, because that is where the committee work can be accomplished, your reports made and then the Senate and the House can act on the reports. The Senate will adjourn for the day in just a few moments, and it will give most you committee chairmen chance, if you do not have public hearings, to have executive sessions. I think there is one committee hearing which is scheduled for tomorrow morning, so it means that the Senate cannot meet tomorrow morning, it will have to meet tomorrow afternoon, so that will give most all committee chairmen an opportunity to meet tomorrow in executive session. would be very hopeful that by tomorrow afternoon all committees would have completed their deliberations and would have had a chance to report out their bills. I recognize there may be one or two exceptions to that, but I would hope it would be limited to that, so that by Monday all committee work may be done and we would then be concerned for the remainder of this session with the matter of considering committee reports.

I just mention these things briefly because we want, of course, to conserve the taxpayers' money. This Special Session is costing approximately ten thousand dollars a day, and it is the position of the leadership that we want to do this work as quickly as possible in the right way. I am sure we will have your cooperation.
