Thursday, January 12, 1967

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Ondon Stairs of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Ross of Piscataquis

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the House and Senate adjourn, they adjourn to Tuesday, January 17th, at 10 o'clock in the morning. (S. P. 55)

ORDERED, that the President of the Senate appoint Senator George H. Barnes of Presque Isle to represent the Senate on the Maine to Quebec Caravan.

Which was Read and Passed.

On motion by Mr. Beckett of Washington

ORDERED, the House concurring, that there be paid to John S. Nelson, Representative of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, and to George Francis, Representative of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians, on account of compensation, the sum of one hundred dollars, plus mileage. (S. P. 54)

Which was Read and Passed.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Johnson of Somerset

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Legislative Finance Officer be authorized to approve the expenses of his office and accounts for payment. (S. P. 53)

Which was Read and Passed.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Reny of York

ORDERED, that thirty-five hundred (3,500) copies of the Governor's Budget Message be printed.

Which was Read and Passed.

On motion by Mr. Johnson of Somerset

ORDERED, that a message be sent to the House of Representatives proposing a convention of both branches in the Hall of the House, for the purpose of extending to His Excellency, Governor Ken-

neth M. Curtis an invitation to attend the Convention and make such communication as pleases him.

Which was Read and Passed.

The Secretary having delivered the message, reported that he had performed the duty assigned to him

Subsequently a message was received from the House, through Representative Harrison Richardson, concurring in the proposition

The Senate retired to the Hall of the House of Representatives where a Joint Convention was formed.
