Tuesday, January 30, 1979 The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker pro tem, Representative Diamond of Windham

Mr. TIERNEY: Mr. Speaker, Men and Women of the House: This bill has been introduced in order to conform our statutes dealing with legislative confirmation to our joint rules

If you review the bill, you will see that all that is being done here is that we are changing the names of several of the committees which do confirmations because our statutes still say "Energy", for example, and we have to change it to "Energy and Natural Resources." We are also sending those confirmations for Human Resources to the Committee on Health and Institutional Services

We are going to appoint some rather unusual rules in order to suspend the rules and move this along as soon as possible, and in doing so hopefully enact it so that these committees can get to work on the confirmation process.

Thereupon, under suspension of the rules and without reference to a Committee, the Bill was read twice and passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

By unanimous consent, ordered sent forthwith to Engrossing.
