The Folling Joint Order: (S. P. 206) ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Joint Rules be amended by adding, after Joint

Rule 37, the following:

37-A. Bills or resolves requiring continued funding No bill or resolve requiring continued funding may be passed by the Legislature unless that bill or resolve carries an appropriation that is sufficient to provide full funding for a complete biennium.

Any funds appropriated pursuant to the first paragraph, but not needed due to the effective date of that bill or resolve, shall not be used for any other purpose, but shall be allocated to the hereby created Budget Stabilization Fund.

Appropriations from the Budget Stabilization Fund may be made by the Legislature, but only for repayment of outstanding General Fund bonds, for purposes for which issuance of bonds has been approved, or for major construction. Major construction is defined as being any single project with a total cost of over \$500,000.
