Dear Senator Sewall and Representative Martin:

In accordance with the provisions of 5 MRSA, Section 1128 (Chapter 573, PL 1977), this is to advise that the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System authorized a 4% increase in retirement benefits paid to retired state employees, teachers and retirees of certain participating local districts, effective September 1, 1980, which was a cost-of-living increase

In addition, this is to advise that the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U), published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, reflected an increase for the 12 months ending June, 1980, of 14.3%
