Pursuant to the provisions of Title 20, M.R.S.A., Chapter 315, Section 8606, I am required to certify annually prior to February I to the Legislature and to the Bureau of the Budget a recommendation for the Funding level for the various program categories in Adult Education.

(This includes programs of High School Completion, Adult Literacy, General Adult Ed, Adult Handicapped, Adult Voc Ed, and Administration) \*For FY 85 the current budget allocation is 1.95 million which leaves a \$308,772 shortfall. Estimates over the past 4 years have run 5% over actual expenses. Therefore, when the \$2,258,772 figure is reduced by 5%, the actual estimated additional need is \$195,833.40. This would meet the State's obligation for Adult Education Subsidy.
