Gentlemen:

I am pleased to submit the recommendations for the management of all-terrain vehicles and the study of this issue for which the Bureau of Parks and Recreation was designated the lead agency by Chapter 301, Public Laws of 1985.

The Bureau chose to employ a consulting firm, MAINE TOMORROW, to carry out the study. The consultants reviewed the programs of other states, interviewed numerous individuals and groups, conducted a telephone survey, assisted the Bureau in the conduct of public hearings, and undertook a number of other assignments at the Bureau's request. With direction from the Bureau and the Advisory Committee which I chaired, the consultants prepared the enclosed report. We believe that it fulfills the Legislature's charge and generally reflects the Bureau's and the other study participants' best thoughts on this pressing issue.

The Bureau's specific recommendations are contained in a separate document and differ only in a few minor points from those presented by the consultants. Suggestions made during the course of the study, but not included in our recommendations, are presented with the reasons for their rejection.

Additionally, we enclose for the Legislature's consideration draft legislation to implement our recommendations, with the exception of that dealing with the decriminalization of certain of the laws pertaining to ATV's. This legislation is being prepared by the District Attorney in Caribou.

The need for a management program for all-terrain vehicles, as well as statutory changes in order to permit easier law enforcement, increased landowner protection, property protection, and greater safety for users, is well documented and widely recognized. We feel the enclosed recommendations represent a balanced, timely and comprehensive response to these needs.

Dear Senator Pray and Representative Martin:

In accordance with the provisions of 5 MRSA, Section 1128, the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System hereby notifies you that a 3.7 per cent increase in retirement benefits paid to retired state employees, teachers and retirees of certain participating local districts was authorized effective September 1, 1985. This was a cost-of-living increase based upon the increase in the Consumer Price Index. The Consumer Price Index (CPI-U), published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, increased 3.7% in the twelve month period ending June 1985.

The 3.7% cost-of-living increase paid to state employees and teachers will cost approximately \$3.8 million in the current year. The total increase in the System's reserve requirements generated by this cost-of-living increase is \$38.9 million.
