Dear Senator Pray and Representative Martin:

In accordance with the provisions of 5 MRSA, Section 17806, the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System hereby notifies you that a 1.7 per cent increase in retirement benefits paid to retired state employees, teachers and retirees of certain participating local districts was authorized effective September 1, 1986. This was a cost-of-living increase based upon the increase in the Consumer Price Index. The Consumer Price Index (CPI-U), published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, increased 1.7

percent in the twelve month period ending June 1986.

The 1.7 percent cost-of-living increase paid to state employees and teachers will cost approximately \$1.8 million in the current year. The total increase in the System's reserve requirements generated by

this cost-of-living increase is \$19.3 million.
