FIRST REGULAR SESSION 53rd Legislative Day Thursday, April 23, 2987

JOINT RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE "DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE" OF THE VICTIMS OF THE NAZI HOLOCAUST WHEREAS, less than 42 years ago, 6 million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other

people suffered as victims of Nazism; and WHEREAS, the people of the State of Maine should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such horrors may never be repeated; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Maine should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of

equal justice for all people; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Maine should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

WHEREAS. April 26th has been designated internationally as a Day of Remembrance of victims of

the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom Hashoah; and

WHEREAS, the national community pursuant to an Act of Congress will be commemorating the week of April 26th through May 3rd as the Remembrance" of the victims of the Nazi Holocaust; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the people of the State of Maine to join in this international

commemoration; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature on behalf of the people of the State of Maine, in memory of the victims of the Nazi Holocaust, recommit ourselves to the lessons of the Nazi Holocaust through this international week of the commemoration and express our common desire to continually strive to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through education, vigilance

and resistance; and be it further
RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this Joint Resolution be prepared and transmitted forthwith to the United States Holocaust Memorial Council in Washington, D.C., on behalf of the people of the

State of Maine.

Was read. SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Representative from Portland, Representative Ketover.

Representative KETOVER: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: Over 42 years ago, which through tunnels of time, are eons for some, and only vesterday for others. Six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust so let us remember them for they have no friends. Only 42 years later, we know what they then could not know, that they were alone outside of society, outside of civilization, expelled from time, forgotten by human kind, forsaken by the Almighty himself. They dispaired alone, fought alone, and died alone. But I, too, remember as a second generation my friends and relatives who died.

Let us remember April 26th, which has been designated, internationally, as a day of remembrance but let us never forget the million and a half children who perished. Let us never forget -- so our children and theirs will never forget. May this holocaust never happen again. An act of Congress will be commemorating the week of April 26th through 3rd as the "Days of Remembrance" so we will not

forget.
