Representative CROWLEY; Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: The purpose of this bill is to create a National Disaster Business Assistance Program to be administered by FAME and the Natural Disaster Home Assistance Program to be administered by the Maine State Housing Authority. Not only would these bills come under the preview of the Committee on Economic Development but due to the emergency clause on the flood and the fact that the bill calls for a transfer of \$4 million from the Rainy Day Fund, the Committee on Economic Development feels that, for expediency, we should refer the bill to the Committee on Appropriations. My Economic Development Committee also instructed me to never do this again.

It also covers the employees who are injured after the effective date, not prior to the effective date.
