### ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTEENTH MAINE LEGISLATURE SECOND REGULAR SESSION 5th Legislative Day

The following Joint Resolution: (S.P. 783) JOINT RESOLUTION IN MEMORY OF MARGUERITE YOURCENAR

WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret that one of the world's most distinguished writers, Marguerite Yourcenar, died on December 17, 1987, at her Northeast Harbor home; and

WHEREAS, this world traveler, gifted linguist and fervent ecologist chose the State of Maine and Mount Desert Island as a permanent residence more than 30 years ago; and

WHEREAS, the name she gave to her island home. "Petite Plaisance", indicates the deep attachment she felt for the beauty and serenity of the area, a setting which nurtured many of her finest works; and

WHEREAS, Marguerite Yourcenar was a recipient of numerous literary awards, was a member of the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters, had works translated into 30 languages and had the unique distinction of being the first female member of the Academie Francaise since its creation in the 17th Century by Cardinal Richelieu; and

WHEREAS, the endowment which she created to assist humanistic and ecological areas is a fitting testament to her love for this planet and her commitment to its betterment; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature, now assembled, join President Francois Mitterand of France and others who share this great loss, in paying homage to the strength and independence of her spirit which personified irreplaceable values, and pause in a moment of understanding and prayer to inscribe this token of sympathy and condolence and respectfully request that, when the Legislature adjourns this date, it do so in honor and lasting tribute to Marguerite Yourcenar; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State. be transmitted forthwith to the family of the deceased and the Consul General of France.
