WHEREAS, Waterville is not only historically important in the industrial development of Central Maine. it is famous for Hathaway shirts, worsteds, paper, roofing, lumber, Colby College crowning Mayflower Hill and the Lombard Log Hauler, forerunner of caterpillar treads; and

WHEREAS, once called "Elm City" for its graceful wineglass trees, the City of Waterville is now popular as a commercial, medical and cultural center, and has been a leader in industry and commerce for

the past 100 years; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the 113th Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the Second Regular Session, take this special the Second opportunity on the eve of the centennial of the City of Waterville to commend the officials and citizens of this great city for the success which they have achieved together over the past 100 years and extend to each our sincere hopes and best wishes continued achievement upon entering a 2nd century; and be it further
