Senator KERRY was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the record.

Senator KERRY: Thank you very much Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I apologize for my cold which I am sure many others share the same infliction, but this morning I would like to speak to you regarding the resolution that we passed honoring Mr. Sean MacBride, the individual who was the Nobel Peace Prize Laureate and the founder of Amnesty International.

In addition to these worthy causes of which he worked for he was an irish patriot who worked very hard for the people of Ireland, both North and South to eliminate discrimination and to improve the social economic circumstances of the irish people.

Recently, when I traveled to Ireland to research the MacBride Principles which deals with fair employment and discrimination in that country, I was scheduled to meet with Mr. MacBride. Unfortunately, the day before I arrived he became very ill and he was unable to keep his appointment with me and subsequently, a week later he passed away.

I had this article from the Wall Street Journal passed around to you for your edification only because I feel that the Wall Street Journal would probably treat a person like Sean MacBride with a great deal of scrutiny. We will soon be addressing in this Senate and in this Legislature a series of principles that I think are extremely important to the advocacy of human rights throughout the world. I would like to say that the United States is very well respected throughout the world for it's promotion and advocacies of human and civil rights. Mr. Sean MacBride lived his life for the people of his nation very much like the Martin Luther King's, the Kennedy's and other great americans did during our Civil Rights Movement here in the United States.

I would like to say also that I, as an american legislator, was very pleased to think that the Irish and the British Governments hold our government in such high esteem. Unfortunately, I find myself on a different side of the British Government on the MacBride principles which essentially will advance the principles of equal opportunity employment in Ireland and hopefully, erraticate much of the discrimination that exists there. I won't take any more of your time Mr. President and ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, but I would let you know that it is very important that we take this issue very seriously and we certainly give it every due consideration. I think a lot of people in Northern Ireland are banking on our Legislature and other legislatures throughout the country to address this issue on their behalf. Thank you.
