JOINT RESOLUTION IN MEMORY OF DANA P. STEVENSON

WHEREAS, great shock and sadness filled our chambers on February 11, 1988, with the untimely passing of Dana P. Stevenson, Representative from Unity; and

WHEREAS, Representative Stevenson was a retired elementary school principal and school superintendent whose career in education spanned 32 years; and

WHEREAS, Dana P. Stevenson was dedicated to his constituents and the cause of good government, having served 14 years as first selectmen of the Town of Unity and 4 consecutive terms in the House of

Representatives of the Maine Legislature; and WHEREAS, he liked to stand tall as "Uncle Sam", reminding us of the greatness of our American heritage and the spirit which has given us strength as a nation and pride as citizens; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That, We the Members of the 113th Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the Second Regular Session, pause in a moment of understanding and prayer to inscribe this token of sympathy and condolence to all who share the loss of our dear colleague and respectfully request that when the Legislature adjourns this date it do so in honor and lasting tribute to the deceased; and be it further

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Representative from Waldo, Representative Whitcomb. the

Representative WHITCOMB: Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House: As members of the 113th Legislature, we have twice this session stood and struggled with words to describe the life and accomplishments of a fellow member of this body who has died while in office.

Last Spring, as many of you related your memories of Larry Connolly, I focused on a recent conversation that I enjoyed with that member, a person who I did not know as well as many of you did. I was trying to lock in my memory that image of a caring person as I expect many of you are recalling your memories of Dana P. Stevenson as we remember his life today.

In the last few days, we have heard and read of many ways that Dana touched people's lives and I want to describe to you a few instances I have seen since Dana's passing.

Last Saturday afternoon, I saw Jesse Colwell at the funeral home in Unity. Jesse is a small, stooped man, a farm worker since he returned to Knox, Maine from World War II. It was Dana who took the extra time to sort through confusing state records and eventually find Jesse a recipient of the Prisoner of War plates. Jesse doesn't talk much, he doesn't discuss his experiences as a German prisoner of war, and I doubt that he spoke to anyone at the funeral parlor last Saturday. Jesse just came to say "thank you".

At a grange meeting in the small town of Brooks last Saturday night, I overheard two senior patrons say to each other, "There wasn't anything that Dana wouldn't do to help people." Yes, they were describing the Dana Stevenson that we know but they were commenting about the Dana P. Stevenson that they first met forty years ago as a teacher in a rural school in that town.

At the Stevenson home last Thursday night, the family was trying to make a list of some of Dana's accomplishments and, while doing that, they recalled how Dana arrived home one night about 20 years ago covered with mud. Dana had walked the wet ground that was eventually to become the Mt. View High School complex. Last Thursday night I couldn't help but think of the day last spring when Dana and I stood on the marble steps outside the Governor's Office with the champion basketball teams from Mt. View High School to receive their presentation and to have their picture taken with the Governor of Maine. How proud Dana must have been to have worked so hard as a parent and an educator, to have combined the small, scattered school districts in that rural part of the state, into a system that could be competitive, competitive with anyone else in the State of Maine.

As Dana's son David and I talked last Thursday night, a call came through that said various members of that community had already gotten together and established a scholarship in Dana's name -- that was before seven-thirty last Thursday night.

Those of us in public service in Waldo County and beyond serve in the shadow of Dana P. Stevenson and we will serve in that shadow for a long time to come.

Subsequently, the Resolution was adopted and sent up for concurrence.
