Dear President Pray:

I am pleased to transmit, on behalf of the members of the Systems Assessment Commission, the Commission's Final Report and the study of mental health reform in other states prepared for the Commission.

The Commission's report, if implemented, will effect major changes in Maine's mental health system — public and private — and will, in our opinion, transform the nature and extent of services made available to those affected by mental illness or with mental health needs. At the same time, the changes recommended in the report would have minimal effect on State expenditures in the next twelve to eighteen months.

We hope you, the members of the Legislature and the Administration will find the report useful in taking steps to reform and improve our mental health system.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my personal appreciation for the many contributions Carol Carothers made to the Commission.
