JOINT RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE MEN AND WOMEN OF OUR ARMED FORCES

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, with the authorization of the Congress of the United States, has ordered military action against Iraq in an effort to force Iraqi armed forces from occupied Kuwait; and

WHEREAS, 415,000 men and women of the United States Armed Forces are now involved in armed conflict; and

WHEREAS, 158,000 members of the Reserves and National Guard, including many men and women from Maine, have been called to active duty since August 22, 1990 and may become involved in armed conflict; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature and the people of Maine have the greatest pride in the men and women of the United States Armed Forces and support them in their efforts; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That, We, the Members of the One Hundred and Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session support the swift resolution of this conflict, with a minimum of damage and loss of life; and be it further

RESOLVED: That we unequivocally support the men and women of our Armed Forces who are carrying out their missions with professional excellence, dedicated patriotism and exemplary bravery; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable George H. W. Bush, President of the United States; to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States; to the Secretary of Defense; to the Honorable John R. McKernan, Jr., Governor of the State of Maine; and to Major General Ernest C. Park.
