Senator KANY: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I thought it would be appropriate to say something on the Record about the fire at Maine Yankee. I am just so happy that no one was seriously injured, or that, in fact, no one was injured at all. The fire apparently, reading the newspapers, was in the nonnuclear portion of that plant. But, we could have had a serious catastrophe! And I certainly hope that everyone in this country understands just how serious a catastrophe could have occurred if a fire had actually been in the nuclear portion of that plant.

Maine Yankee has a very good safety record. But, it is an old and aging plant. And, if you do have a major fire or something else happen in the nuclear portion, thousands of people could be either injured, or eventually, get cancer and die. It really is a serious matter!

I remember looking at the Hanford Nuclear Reservation, as Chairman then of the Advisory Commission on Radioactive Waste, when the Chernobyl incident occurred. And I was with several people from the National Conference of State Legislators, who focused on nuclear issues, and the Federal Government didn't have the decency to let us know that Chernobyl had actually occurred. For some reason, and that was my second tour of the Hanford Nuclear Reservation, they chose not to allow us to tour the "N" Reactor that day. The "N" Reactor was almost identical to the facility at Chernobyl. And by the way, the "N" Reactor has not operated since that date, the date of the Chernobyl catastrophe. I

did not learn until arriving in Los Vegas later that night, on television, about the Chernobyl disaster. I am just very concerned about the potential for catastrophes at such plants.

I wanted to share that information with you. I was sorry that the Maine Yankee officials did not choose to let us know immediately about this fire. We still do not seem to understand and know the facts, and the public has not been informed about the extent of the damage. But, I am just very pleased, very, very, very pleased, that as far as we know now, there was nothing major that occurred, and it is was not in the nuclear portion of the plant where a fire could occur. Thank you.

Senator HOLLOWAY: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I have the distinction of being the Senator who lives the closest to Maine Yankee. Me on one side, and Senator Cahill of Sagadahoc on the other side. I must say that the cries of alarm have not reached me yet. We do have an 800 number, Maine Yankee is just across the other island from where I live, and very fortunately, no great calls have been coming in on the 800 line or on my line at home. So apparently, people in the area are very convinced that there is no danger to them at the present time. Thank you.
