THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would advise members, during the last several months the question of Sexual Harassment, obviously has been put to the forefront of discussion. As you may recall, we passed a law last June, Chapter 474 Public Law to require all employees of the State to undertake various steps to insure a work place free of sexual harassment. The Legislative Council has just adopted a policy. The Chair would ask the members to pay The Legislative Council has just adopted attention:

Pursuant to the statutes that we passed. The Legislative Council has adopted a policy regarding sexual harassment this week. The policy is designed to help employees understand what sexual harassment is and provide guidance for anyone who has questions or feel that they are being harassed. We are distributing copies of this policy to each of you as part of the notification process in that law. I would ask you to read the policy carefully. As you know sexual harassment has recently been the focus of national attention as well.

Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances. Requests for sexual favors or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature. Defining specific offensive behavior that falls within the definition of sexual harassment can be difficult. Many times people can behave in a way that they think is acceptable, but at the same time another person feels very uncomfortable. The key to that is it is unwelcome. Some examples of unacceptable behavior is offensive sexual flirtation, verbal or physical abuse of a sexual nature, sexual suggestive gestures, a display of sexual suggestive objects, pictures, written materials or sexual practical jokes.

Let me stress that sexual harassment is illegal. Each one of us bears a responsibilty to ensure that all legislative employees are treated with dignity and able to work in an environment that is free of sexual insulting or degrading remarks, intimidation or retaliation. I think the policy is clear but I would encourage each of the members to read the policy and to see myself or other members of leadership if you have a question.

The policy will be distributed to each and everyone of you. I need to remind you of this situation in your committee work, with the non partisan staff, the partisan staff, and with your colleagues.
