Dear Mr. Speaker and Mr. President:
In accordance with Title 5, Maine Revised Statutes Annotated, Section 1547, the accompanying Financial Report of the State of Maine is submitted for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1991.

The first section of the report consists of the General Purpose Financial Statements for all funds reported in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Generally accepted accounting principles for the Governmental Funds uses the modified accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when they become measurable and available current assets. Expenditures are gener gnized when the related fund liability generally recognized when the related generally incurred. Exceptions t.o accepted accounting principles in these financial statements include accumulated unpaid vacation and sick leave which has not been recorded, and interest on general long-term debt which is recognized when due.

The second section is reported as it has been in the past, based upon the budgetary and legal requirements. Please refer to Note 7 of the General Notes to the Financial Statements for the reconciliation of the fund balances between the two sections. Comparative budgetary data and statistical information have also been included in this report to promote a better understanding of the State's finances.

Questions and comments about this report or any phase of State finances are always welcome.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Pearson.

Senator **PEARSON:** Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. In reference to the Legislative Sentiment recognizing:

John Thompson, whose incredible courage and overwhelming determination in seeking help after sustaining a devastating injury while working on his family's farm near Hurdsfield, North Dakota has gained him the respect and admiration of the citizens of Maine; and it is with genuine regard that we extend our support in his efforts toward a successful

Each and everyone of the members of the Senate, with the exception of one person, has signed a letter to John Thompson from Hurdsfield, North Dakota, whom we have been reading about in papers for the last

week or so, about his heroic, tenacious struggle he has had with the loss of both of his arms in a farming accident in North Dakota. I think his determination and his strength has captured the imagination of all of America, certainly the people of the State of Maine. There is a great deal of pride that I sponsored this sentiment, along with the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Emerson. This sentiment will be sent to him in North Dakota.

It is seldom that we read in the paper or hear reports of anybody who has quite the bravery and the fortitude this young man demonstrated on the day he was involved in the farming accident. As the story goes, the young man lost both of his arms while doing some chores at his home and got into his house by using his teeth and his feet. He picked up a pen, dialed the phone to his cousin, who called an ambulance. After having completed that, he went into the bathroom so he wouldn't bleed on his mother's rug. I think he must know my mother too, I would have felt the same way. The ambulance arrived, the people that were in the ambulance crew were not very well trained, but they had the presence of mind to pack his arms in ice. They took his arms to a Medical Center in Minnesota and reattached them. I understand he is now gaining some feeling in his arms, but probably will not have the use of them soon, maybe never. Nevertheless, this is a real dramatic story of an All American boy.
