Senator **CLARK**: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. In response to the question tendered by the good Senator from Penobscot, Senator Bost, my understanding of this Bill, as Amended, is that it extends the same duties and liabilities to ice skating rink operators and persons who use them as was extended in a rather immediate previous Session to Roller Skating Rinks.
