Mr. Coture was an establishment in Lewiston politics having served for literally decades in the City Council. He also served many terms in the State House of Representatives and also in this Body with dignity. Paul will be remembered as a very colorful, feisty, democratic politician. He could either be a foe who could frustrate one into submission or he could be a strong and powerful ally depending upon this cause which one espoused. Of Paul, it can be said that at all times he acted with the best interest of the people of his district of Lewiston. He was a strong pro labor advocate. He also was a strong and powerful voice for the working men and women of the City of Lewiston.

There are many stories that can be told of Paul. He served twenty terms on the Lewiston City Council. I can recall, as a young boy, the City Council debates that Paul was foremost involved in. When I went into public service Paul was still on the City Council in Lewiston. Late in his public life someone ran against him in Ward 6 for the Councilor position. By that time Paul was such an institution that the voting place was named for him, the Paul Couture Recreation Center. We had great debate, in the City of Lewiston, on how we could assure fairness, after all the voting place was named after the Alderman. It was finally decided that the Public Works Department would come in and put a blanket over the name of the Paul Couture Recreation Center. As you may know Paul won that election. I suspect if the election were held in Ward 1 totally across the city, he still would have won.

city, he still would have won. Paul helped me a great deal when I first came into public life. We didn't agree on many issues. He was very conservative and I am more liberal on some issues. He always took the time to offer help no matter how busy he was. It was very genuine and sincere. Paul's phone was always busy. He was always receiving phone calls from people around the city who needed help, housing, or nutrition. Paul Couture was truly loved by the people of Lewiston and he is truly an instituion to the people in our city. We will sorely miss him. Thank you Mr. President.

Senator GAUVREAU of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record. Senator GAUVREAU: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I appreciate your indulgence. I truly had not intended to rise again. I was handed a note a moment ago which summarizes comments which our Governor has made on Maine Public Broadcasting this evening regarding the action taken by the Committee on Judiciary. Although we would like to end this session on a positive note, I feel an obligation to put into record some remarks. I had asked the reporter the courtesy of speaking to me prior to running the story. I understand the story was broadcast at 5:30 p.m. therefore, he had to run his story without having the chance to receive commentary from a committee member who was on the Judiciary.

As you perhaps have noticed there was one controversial nomination in front of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary and that was the nominee to the Maine Human Rights Commission, Betsy Levenson. The Committee divided on that vote, I believe the vote was 6 to reject the nomination and 5 to confirm. As you will also note the Governor has withdrawn the name of the nominee, therefore, I will not make any comments regarding the nomination itself.

I understand the Governor was quoted as saying, "the nomination was decided not on the merits as is the case with most nomination hearings." Further the Governor stated the nominee was "treated shabbily by the committee." I have served almost ten years in the Maine Legislature. For those of you who know me, I have a deep and abiding love for the law in our State. I have found that all members I have the priviledge of serving on the Committee on Judiciary with share those feelings. We may not always agree on philosophy or on the fitness of a particular nominee. When we take the oath of office we have an obligation to consider the nominations for any judicial positions based upon their merits and our understanding of what the requirements are and what they should be for a person who discharges quasi judicial responsibility. I don't know how to say this any more plainly. As a member of the Bar of the State of Maine, I take that responsibility very seriously. I fully understand and can distinguish between matters of philosophy, partisanship, and matters of scrutinizing the fitness of a particular person for a quasi judicial position.

Last week as I was on my way to umpire my first Little League Softball game and the Governor was on the radio saying that the Judiciary Committee tabled the nomination. That tabeling nomination was made out of respect for me. I asked the members of my committee for time to think about the nomination before I decided how I would cast my vote. Even the tabeling motion was characterized as partisan and political. I certainly understand and respect that reasonable people may view differently the qualifications of any nominee. The fact remains that I very carefully assessed this nominee. I spent a great deal of time considering the testimony of the nominee. I received a number of telephone calls. I reviewed the testimony for the committee and I spent literally hours walking and trying to sort out how I would cast my vote.

I am not sure how we have evolved to this state in Maine politics where the mutual distrust has entered the Judiciary hearings in terms of fitness of nominees for a particular position. It is a sad day indeed. It is not my responsibility or goal to cast fingers or to place blame. If we are to have a society where we have ultimate faith in people who serve in our courts or quasi judicial positions then we have to have a process to which we can all buy into. A process which we believe is fair and does carefully scrutinize the ability of persons to hold judicial positions. There is tremendous power in the Judicial Branch of Government. I have practiced law for seventeen years and during those seventeen years I have, in fact, formed some insights into judicial temperment. I understand reasonable minds can differ in that area. I do not appreciate the characterization of my behavior or the conduct or voting of the people who voted with me against the nominee as pure politics. I must tell you in all candor, that it is my belief there are people who would use these types of situations only to advance their political career. I am first and foremost a Maine citizen. I love the law and I love this State as do you. That is why we choose public service. At some point in time we have to declare certain types of political shenanigans off limits. In my capacity as the Senate Chair on the Committee on Judiciary these types of comments are off limits. Those who love and revere the law, I say enough is enough. Our Governor has an unfortunate tendency to cast as partisan Legislative activities with which he does not agree. It is a tendency which does not serve him well nor the people of Maine well. I respect the powers of the Governor and the authority of the Governor. I respect the Governor's perogative in nominating persons for judicial and quasi judicial services. I also respect and revere the authority that this Legislatiave Body has to cast its own independent judgements. If people want to question the wisdom of our behavior that is not only their right but is their responsibility in a democratic society. With that right there is responsiblity, the debate and commentary has to be fair, reasonable and

has to be based upon principles of mutual respect. Today, unfortunately, the comments of our Governor transcended those parameters. I deeply regret that. I do not wish at all to extend the unfortunate discussion which has gone on about this nomination. I felt it important to put these remarks on the record. I certainly hope that those who come after me and will have the unique priviledge to serve on the Committee on Judiciary will take their responsibilities very seriously.

As I approach retirement I have thought back to those very few cases when I cast votes against nominees of Governor Brennan and Governor McKernan. My one regret and it is a regret, that on some occasions I was too willing to give the benefit of the doubt to a certain nominee when my intellect and my experience and my perceptive capacity told me that the person would not be fit for service. It is a humbling process for those of us to sit in judgement of other people. Who are we to sit in judgement of others? The reality is that our Legislature has established a process whereby Legislators sit in on confirmation proceedings and cast their judgements based upon their own individual sense of what is right. To the extent that any member of this Legislature, regardless of what his or her party affiliation might be, to the extent that anyone tries to shill the independent exercise of that Legislator in reviewing nomination for judicial service, I think that is a great concern I would have. I trust that those who come after me will use their independent judgement with a sense of honor and commitment to do what they personally believe is right. They will not be intimidated by the actions of others outside this Body who try to influence their behavior. I take this very seriously and I am truly disappointed by the comments of our Chief Executive Officer this evening. Thank you Mr. President.
