## JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING SAMUEL D. SHAPIRO ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT

WHEREAS, the Treasurer of State is a constitutional officer of the State of Maine, who is authorized to receive and keep records of all items of income accruing to the State, and to deposit, reconcile and invest funds for the State, and to sell and keep records of all bonds for the State; and

WHEREAS, Samuel D. "Sam" Shapiro, of Waterville, was first elected Treasurer of State by the 109th Legislature in 1980 and has served for the last 16 years with his unique sense of humor, dedication and hard work. He has been an activist Treasurer of State who has helped restore the State's strong bond rating and has also managed a program that has generated as much as \$3,000,000 a year for the state budget in abandoned property; and

WHEREAS, Sam Shapiro was a former high school teacher, coach and businessman who was selected Northeast Treasurer

of the Year by the Northeast Treasurers Association, and who also has earned a reputation as a talented gardener and political fund-raiser; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the members of the Senate and the members of the House of Representatives and the citizens they represent to formally recognize the accomplishments of the Treasurer of State, Sam Shapiro, on the occasion of his retirement, and to express the high esteem and affection in which he is held; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the 118th Legislature now assembled in the First Regular Session, take this opportunity to honor Treasurer of State Sam Shapiro, to recognize his distinguished service to the people of the State of Maine over many years and to offer our congratulations and very best wishes for the future; and be it further
