**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Benoit.

Senator **BENOIT**: Thank you Mr. President, may it please the Senate. I'm concerned over this measure and wish to speak against further proceeding with it and would like to be heard.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may proceed.

Senator BENOIT: This bill is here because during the last session, as you will recall, the Governor appointed a County Commissioner in Franklin County to serve on the Land Use Regulation Commission. The appointment had to be withdrawn. I went to the public hearing and indicated that, on occasion, because of LURC work and the County Commissioner's duties, they would confront one another and that there was an opinion, I believe, by the Attorney General's Office that there was a conflict of interest that a County Commissioner could not simultaneously hold that office and the office on LURC. If you take a look at the duties of a County Commissioner and the duties of LURC you will find that they confront one another in unorganized areas of the state and it's possible, because of the duties running counter to one another, that a person in litigation could be on both sides of the case. You could find yourself with LURC being a moving party. You could find yourself being a defendant of the counties involved with LURC and if the county has a matter with LURC, you could find the moving party a County Commissioner. It seems to me that we have a problem enacting into law a conflict of interest to promote a situation where you have to wear two hats in doing your duty. And just because, last session, the Governor's appointment had to be withdrawn because of a conflict of interest does not mean we just turn around and write into law a situation which still is going to find the person in a conflict of interest. And so, I would ask that this matter not be promoted further and I would ask for a roll call.
