SENATOR PHILIP E. HARRIMAN: Good morning. It's great to see you all again. I'm sure, like you, I have stories of what has happened in the past week and I'd like to share just one of them with you before our prayer. My business responsibilities took me out-of-state the first two days of the storm. Of course, I'm paying the price at home because we were without power for six days and I only experienced four of them. But I wanted to share with you this morning that in the height of this meeting I attended, Maine became the number one story in the national news. All of the newspapers and the television stations were talking about 500,000 people being without power. And it looked as though Paul Bunyan, in a fit of rage, had come through and just knocked the tops of the trees to the ground. And people said to me, "500,000 people without power, where's everybody going to go?" And I said, "Well, they're with their friends and their families and their neighbors." And the look of amazement on their faces was inspiring. And I think if there's one truth that was self-evident throughout this disaster is that Maine is indeed made up of people with inherent goodwill and generosity. And indeed, it was an honor to say, "I'm from Maine.'

Would you join me in prayer?

Heavenly Father, we offer our full measure of praise for our creation in Your image, and for Your preserving mercy all of our days. From every family, from every part of this wonderful and special place called Maine, with thank You for the women and men who risked their lives to restore electricity and for those who opened their hearts and homes to help a neighbor in need. We thank You for the protection and comfort of our homes, for the binding tie of mutual love, for Your healing power, Your comfort and presence in sorrow, for work bestowed upon us in this great chamber and the strength with which to do it. Dear President Lawrence:

In accordance with Title 9-B MRSA §217, as amended, I am submitting to the members of the Maine House and Senate a report entitled "The Status of Maine's Financial Institutions."

Capital and earnings, two of the three primary indicators of an institution's well-being, continue to improve for Maine's financial institutions and are at very strong levels. While there is increasing scrutiny directed to asset quality, the third primary indicator, ratios remain sound and there has been little factual evidence of slippage among Maine's institutions. The continued improvement in the State's economy and the strength of the financial institutions should further complement each other. The community banks have performed very well and continue to provide valuable services to Maine businesses and consumers.

During the past year, Maine made far-reaching changes to modernize the State's financial industry, culminating in the creation of a "universal bank charter" which grants broad and uniform powers to banks and thrift institutions. Other high points of the legislative changes included the elimination of numerous regulatory burdens that unnecessarily impeded management's discretion, an expansion of closely related activities, and the creation of "niche banks" with no or limited deposit-taking ability. These changes substantially enhance the state charter option, and most importantly, provide enhanced services and products that benefit the businesses and consumers of Maine. Unfortunately, financial modernization legislation at the federal level failed to pass again.

The constant and rapid evolvement in technology is increasingly challenging the Bureau, as well as the industry. The proliferation of computer banking, be it in the form of ATMs, telephone-banking, banking on the Internet, etc., is changing the face of banking as we have historically known it, requiring new skills and flexibility. The Year 2000 issue - the ability of computers to handle reference dates beyond December 31, 1999 - has been defined as a "corporate-wide challenge for financial institutions, their vendors, business partners, counter parties, and customers." The Bureau will closely monitor progress toward Year 2000 compliance of all Maine financial institutions.
