Congratulations on your recent election as leaders of the 119<sup>th</sup> Legislature. The Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission looks forward to working with you and members of the new Legislature over the next two years.

Resolves 1997, Chapter 45, requires the Commission to conduct a study of the impact of Maine Civil Laws on the Wabanaki People in Maine and to "report its findings and legislative recommendations...to the First Regular Session of the 119<sup>th</sup> Legislature..." The Commission's report, entitled *Impact of Maine Civil Laws on the Wabanaki: 1998*, recommends two new pieces of legislation (relating to child welfare services for Wabanaki children and the enforcement of Tribal Court orders) and legislation that failed to pass by one vote during the 118<sup>th</sup> Legislature (tribal land use regulation). We have submitted these three proposals to the Office of Revisor of Statutes and the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis.

We will be happy to discuss our findings and recommendations with members of the 119<sup>th</sup> Legislature after you reconvene in January. In accordance with 20-A M.R.S.A., section 15618-A, a report of all school administrative unit state and local revenues designated for K-12 education in their FY 99 budgets has been compiled and a copy is provided for your use.

It should be noted that the amounts budgeted in the various categories may not be the same as actual expenditures for these categories, for the following reasons:

- 1. Some budgeted amounts may be unexpended and carried forward to the following year. The statewide balance forward, for all budget categories, is usually between 2% and 3%.
- 2. School administrative units which do not utilize a line-item budget may transfer funds to other categories.

3. For certain types of funds that are transferred between school administrative units (for tuition costs and for transportation and other services provided to another school administrative unit) the amount is budgeted in both school administrative units since each unit must appropriate these funds. Since these instances cannot be netted out in the State Total Summary, the state totals will overestimate actual expenditures to some degree.

## PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE & SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES STATE OF MAINE

WHEREAS, the rules of the House of Representatives and the Senate and the Joint Rules established procedures and protocols of the Legislature and are important for the orderly functioning of the Legislature;

WHEREAS, the Legislature benefits from periodic review of the rules to assure the rules facilitate the effective operations of the Legislature, in keeping with its Constitutional responsibilities; and

ESTABLISHED, that the Special Committee on Legislative Rules is established as follows.

- Committee established. The Special Committee on Legislative Rules, referred to as the "committee", is established.
- Membership. The committee consists of 10 members appointed as follows.
- The President of the Senate shall appoint 5 members from the Senate who have expertise or interest in rules of the Legislature. These members shall constitute a subcommittee to review the Senate rules.
- 4. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 5 members from the House of Representatives who have expertise or interest in rules of the Legislature. These members shall constitute a subcommittee to review the House rules.
- The first named member of each subcommittee shall be the Chair.
- Convening of special committee. When the appointment of all members is complete, the chairs of the committee shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee which shall occur no later than January 6, 1999.
- 7. Duties. The Committee shall review all proposed rule changes suggested by members of the Legislature that are intended to be considered prior to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday in January, 1999. The committee shall report their recommendations in the form of an order to amend the rules. This order shall be submitted in a timely fashion so the Legislature can consider these proposed changes before the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday in January, 1999. Following the completion of the initial amending process, the committee shall conduct a general review of the rules of the Legislature.
- Meetings. In conducting its duties, the committee may meet at times and locations approved jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- Staff assistance. The Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee.
- 10. Reimbursement. Members of the committee are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, Section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the committee outside of the Legislative session.
- 11. Report. The committee shall complete its work and submit a report of its findings and recommendations relating to rules of the Legislature, along with any suggested rule amendments, to the Legislature by the convening of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regular Session.
