Dear President Lawrence:

In accordance with Title 9-B MRSA §217, as amended, I am submitting to the members of the Maine House and Senate a report entitled "The Status of Maine's Financial Institutions."

Maine's financial institutions continue to be in sound condition with strong capital, earnings and asset quality. While the institutions have benefited from the continued improvement in the State's economy, their commitment to financing local businesses and consumers has played a significant role in this economic growth. Due to increased speculation that the current economic expansion may be plateauing, the Bureau has heightened its scrutiny of loan quality. To date, the results of this intensified review have shown that credit underwriting standards remain at acceptable levels. Overall, Maine's financial institutions are well-positioned to confront a softening economy.

At this time, Maine's financial institutions are also in a satisfactory position with respect to Year 2000 ("Y2K") issues, as nearly all of Maine's financial institutions have a favorable Y2K rating. Bank regulators have implemented a very comprehensive supervisory program to ensure that financial institutions, heavily dependent upon computers, are prepared for Y2K. The Bureau is working closely with the federal regulators to continue to monitor the institutions' progress. As we move toward yearend, it is critical that public confidence be maintained in the payments system.

The Bureau was pleased that several private, non-bank financial services companies opted to expand their product offerings by taking advantage of the State's 1997 modernization of its financial industry. During 1998, five niche banks were either approved or commenced operations. The State's financial institutions also took advantage of recent legislative and regulatory changes as they seek to retain and then expand their customer and revenue base in the face of increased competition, particularly from non-banks. Failure at the federal level to pass modernization legislation continues to restrict institutions' ability to fully utilize Maine's progressive Banking Code.
