I am pleased to present to you and members of the 119<sup>th</sup>
Legislature a copy of MDOT's Biennial Transportation
Improvement Program (BTIP) for the FY 2000 - FY 2001
biennium. This document represents priority capital
improvements associated with all modes of transportation and
continues the principles established under Maine's Sensible
Transportation Policy Act (STPA) and the Federal Transportation
Efficiency Act (TEA-21). This program also reflects priorities
established through a multi-tiered public involvement process in
the development and updates of the 20-Year Statewide
Improvement Program and Six-Year Plan.

The goals of this program are to:

- Maintain and improve Maine's highway system
- Continue an increased level of investment in aging state and local bridges
- Support and enhance the state's passenger transportation system
- Further expand freight transportation options for Maine business and industry
- Continue needed improvements at airports
- Promote safety for all modes of transportation
- Promote bicycle and pedestrian projects, and
- Continue activities that enhance the environment

Funding necessary to deliver this program is anticipated from federal, state and local sources, and represents a total investment of \$440 Million. The state share of this program is 25% and has been set forth under Governor King's Highway Fund Budget and bonding proposals.

This BTIP reflects a stronger state role with regard to capital projects inside urban compact areas and it represents a renewed

commitment to rural economic development associated with the lifting of springtime postings on state roads.

We look forward to working with all interested parties on accomplishing the goals of this program.
