THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Murray.

Senator MURRAY: Thank you, Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. Very briefly I wanted to rise to explain a little bit about this Bill because the tittle is somewhat deceptive of what is now before us. The Bill, as you can see, is entitled "An Act to Require Auctions for Confiscated Firearms". The Committee, in its 12-1 vote, Amended that original Bill to allow for an auction to occur in much the same way that auctions now occur involving firearms and other seized assets by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. Right now the firearms that are confiscated by police authorities throughout the state can be used by the authorities for training purposes, they can be destroyed, or they can be auctioned to federally licensed firearm dealers. We kept all of those options in the revised Amended Bill that's now before you and only added the opportunity to auction to the public, not just federally licensed firearm dealers, so that all those options remain. It is not a requirement that the auction take place, it simply allows that to occur. So I would urge you to join me and the other twelve members of the Criminal Justice Committee who supported this Amendment.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Kennebec, Senator Carey.

Senator CAREY: Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to pose a question to the good Senator from Penobscot.

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Carey may pose his question.

Senator CAREY: In the change that you've made, Senator, have you taken into account the background checks of the person off the street who may in fact be securing one of these instruments?
