# JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING PARKINSON'S DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a brain disorder that usually affects adults over 40, although it can appear in younger persons; and

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease, or paralysis agitans, is a devastating, painful and incurable brain disorder of unknown origin that disrupts and can end the lives of those who suffer from it as well as overwhelming the lives of their families and friends; and

WHEREAS, more individuals suffer from Parkinson's disease than multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy and Lou Gehrig's disease combined; and

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease often takes an enormous emotional, psychological and physical toll on the families surrounding their suffering loved ones; and

WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease appears in approximately one in 4 persons older than 80 years of age and in one in 10 persons older than 60 years of age, thereby directly touching the lives of at least one in 10 families in the State; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Parkinson Disease Association there are approximately 1.5 million people in the United States diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, of which 7,000 or more are in the State of Maine; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of Parkinson's disease--stillness, tremors, slowness, poor movement and difficulty with balance

and speaking--are often mistaken as a normal part of the aging process; and

WHEREAS, the cause of the disease is unknown and drugs can only control some of the symptoms of Parkinson's disease for a short period of time; and

WHEREAS, April 11th has been proclaimed to be World Parkinson's Day, a day for all to recognize the need for more research and help in dealing with the devastating effects of Parkinson's disease; and

WHEREAS, increased education and research are needed to help find more effective treatments and ultimately a cure for Parkinson's disease and to provide more effective support programs and services to Parkinson's disease patients and their caregivers and families; and

WHEREAS, the leading public officials of the State and leading officials in the State's medical community are now called upon to aid in reversing the invisibility and voicelessness of its citizens suffering from Parkinson's disease; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Nineteenth Legislature, now assembled in the First Regular Session, recognize the month of April as Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month throughout the State of Maine; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable copy of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Maine Parkinson Society and to the American Parkinson Disease Association, Maine Chapter.

# JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION TO SUPPORT A SINGLE AREA CODE FOR THE STATE

WE, your Memorialists, the members of the One Hundred and Nineteenth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Federal Communications Commission, as follows:

WHEREAS, the citizens of the State of Maine currently share a single telephone area code throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, a single telephone area code provides for nearly 8,000,000 telephone numbers for a population of only 1,200,000 people; and

WHEREAS, the current method for assigning blocks of telephone numbers is inefficient and wasteful, resulting in the assignment of more than 5,000,000 telephone numbers in Maine, most of which are unused and unusable; and

WHEREAS, this inefficient and wasteful system now threatens the loss of a single area code in Maine; and

WHEREAS, the costs and inconvenience to both residential and commercial telephone users of being forced to accept a 2nd telephone area code within the State are enormous; and

WHEREAS, technology will soon be available which will allow for a 10-fold increase in the efficiency of assigning telephone numbers; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission has prevented the Maine Public Utilities Commission and the utility regulators of other states from implementing code conservation measures; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, hereby urge the Federal Communications Commission to permit the Maine Public Utilities Commission to implement code conservation measures at this time in order to temporarily avoid the need to go to a 2nd area code for Maine until such time as the technology is available for efficient number administration; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable copy of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Federal Communications Commission.

That is what legislation is supposed to do. This proposed legislation is a solution looking for a problem. It doesn't exist. On its very best day it could be termed anti-consumerism. I hesitate in these Chambers to tell you what it could be called on its worst day. However, before us is a piece of legislation, so-called, that really cannot stand the test of need. Why do we need this? We can drive down the road, look at the prices posted and make a decision. We're supposedly intelligent consumers. If we see that price we can make that decision. If we don't see the price we can't make an intelligent decision. Pure and simple. We make the choices now. Nobody is going to turn off the gas pump because we make those choices. The world's not going to come to an end tomorrow. The gas pumps are not going to turn off. We have the information upon which we can base an intelligent decision now. A problem does not exist now. This Bill cannot exist now either. Thank you, Mr. President.
