# JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE SECRETARY OF THE NAVY AND THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE TO NAME A SHIP IN HONOR OF THE CITY OF BATH

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Nineteenth Legislature of the State of Maine, now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Secretary of the Navy, the Honorable Richard Danzig and the Secretary of Defense, the Honorable William Cohen as follows:

WHEREAS, the Bath Iron Works Corporation is currently developing and constructing the United States Navy's newest

surface combatant, along with the Avondale Shipyard in Louisiana: and

WHEREAS, the 3rd ship to be constructed and launched at the Bath Iron Works Corporation facility in the City of Bath, Maine is identified as LPD 19; and

WHEREAS, the Bath Iron Works Corporation is now in its 115th year of constructing and launching superior quality ships on the shores of the Kennebec River in the City of Bath; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bath has an international reputation for its shipbuilding heritage and shipbuilding activity, which is exemplary of the maritime legacy of the State of Maine; and

WHEREAS, the maritime heritage of the City of Bath is intrinsically linked to the history of the city itself because the success and growth of the city is so closely intertwined with the shipbuilding industry; and

WHEREAS, it would be entirely appropriate and fitting to honor the maritime history and heritage of the City of Bath by naming LPD 19 the U.S.S. Bath; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, request that LPD 19 be named the U.S.S. Bath after the City of Bath, Maine, where it was built, in order to properly honor that city for its role in the shipbuilding industry of the State and for its role in the shipbuilding history of our great seafaring nation; and be it further
