Senator **GOLDTHWAIT**: Thank you Madam Chairman. This is a Bill that met an accidental death due to some confusion about one of the issues involved and with the leave of the Chairs of the Committees, I'm requesting permission to have this Recalled and Reconsidered.

Pursuant to Joint Rule 404 a Division was had. 31 Members of the Senate having voted in the affirmative, and no Senators having voted in the negative, and 31 being more than two-thirds of those present and voting, the Joint Order was **PASSED**.

On motion by Senator LONGLEY of Waldo (Cosponsored by Representative THOMPSON of Naples), the following Joint Order: S.P. 767

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Joint Select Committee to Review the Maine Tort Claims Act is established as follows.

- 1. Committee established. The Joint Select Committee to Review the Maine Tort Claims Act, referred to in this order as the "committee," is established.
- Membership. The committee consists of 13 members appointed as follows.
- A. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members from the Senate who either serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary or are interested in reviewing the Maine Tort Claims Act.
- B. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 10 members from the House of Representatives who either serve on the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary or are interested in reviewing the Maine Tort Claims Act.
- Chairs. The first Senate member named is the Senate chair and the first House member named is the House chair.
- 4. Appointments; convening committee. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this order. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the chairs of the committee shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee no later than 60 days following the effective date of this order.
- 5. Duties. The committee shall review the Maine Tort Claims Act including, but not limited to, the limitation on damages established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, section 8105, subsection 1 and the experience of the Legislature in acting upon claims submitted to the Legislature pursuant to section 8105, subsection 3.
- Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee.
- 7. Compensation. Members of the committee are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the committee.
- 8. Report. The committee shall submit a report along with any recommended legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary no later than November 1, 1999. Following receipt of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary may introduce legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. If the committee requires an extension of time to make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
- Committee budget. The chairs of the committee, with assistance from the committee staff, shall administer the committee's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the

committee shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The committee may not incur expenses that would result in the committee exceeding its approved budget.

Upon request from the committee, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the Executive Director's designee shall provide the committee chair and staff with a status report on the study budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that there is a trend in other states to change the way in which income of multistate businesses is apportioned for income tax purposes; and

WHEREAS, the interaction of different apportionment approaches creates a disincentive for capital investment in Maine; and

WHEREAS, this trend may be placing Maine at a competitive disadvantage in attracting and retaining investment and jobs; now, therefore, be it

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Commission to Study Single-sales Factor Apportionment is established as follows:

- Commission established. The Commission to Study Single-sales Factor Apportionment, referred to in this order as the "commission," is established.
- Membership. The commission consists of the following 11 members:
- A. The State Tax Assessor or the State Tax Assessor's designee;
- B. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development or the commissioner's designee;
- C. Three members from the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate. Two of these members must be members of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation and one member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development;
- D. Four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House. Three of these members must be members of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation and one member must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development; and

- E. Two members of the business community appointed by the Governor.
- 3. Chairs. The first Senate member named is the Senate chair. The first House member named is the House chair.
- 4. Appointments; convening commission. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this order. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than August 15, 1999.
  - 5. Duties. The commission has the following duties:
- A. To gather information pertaining to single-sales factor corporate income tax apportionment, including, without limitation, the experience of other states that have adopted single-sales factor corporate income tax apportionment; and
- B. To make recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation as to the advisability of adopting single-sales factor corporate income tax apportionment in the State, including any recommendations for legislation.
- 6. Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Fiscal and Program Review shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services shall provide information and services as requested by the commission.
- 7. Compensation. Legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the commission.
- 8. Report. The commission shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation by January 1, 2000. The Joint Standing Committee on Taxation may introduce legislation in the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature to implement the recommendations of the commission.
- 9. Commission budget. The chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its approved budget.

Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's designee shall provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the study budget expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Senator RUHLIN: Thank you Madam President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, this morning it is my pleasure to report to you first of all how well we did as a group in our Legislative Memorial Scholarship fund-raising event recently. But more importantly to provide awards to the recipients of this years scholarship awards.

First of all, I just want to inform you that we did very well this year. We raised over \$16,000, for the Legislative Scholarship Fund. Then subtract about \$3,000 in expenses, and we end up with \$13,000 net going to our fund that will be available for scholarships in the future. We try to give one scholarship annually per county. We have a very stringent selection process, I will remind you, that picks those students who really show academic promise, as well as, a well rounded promise to the future. We believe that we try to support education in this building in many ways. Who budgets support to propose a proeducation legislation. So this morning we have 11 of those recipients with us and if I may, Madam President, approach the podium to give those awards out. I would ask when the names are given that the Senator from that county also accompany the recipient to the podium. Then they will receive their awards. To the student the most important thing is the money. But before I do that, I do want to thank everybody in the entire building who has participated in it, I also, want to give special thanks to MES for their special help. They provided a pamphlet that is on your desk this morning, very well done, and gives a thumbnail sketch of the program itself, and also how we did this year. I hope you will look at that and just take a moment for self congratulations for a job well done by all of you. Now if I may approach the Well of the Senate.
