Off Record Remarks

Senator **BENNETT** of Oxford was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator BENNETT: Thank you Mr. President. Fellow members of the Senate, recently in this Chamber my colleague from Kennebec, Senator Carey, castigated a member of the State bureaucracy. His comments stemmed from a memo the bureaucrat authored, which he viewed as a veiled threat to memo recipients. Well today I offer a similar concern about an abuse of power by another member of the bureaucracy. This particular instance has all the elements of a George Orwell novel. This week I became aware of an incident where Attorney Jeff Pidot, of the Attorney General's Office, contacted the author of a private e-mail to inform the writer that, and I quote, the words used are designed not to inform the debate or even as political rhetoric, these words are designed to strike fear in people. Please bear this in mind. End quote.

First, to me, it is appalling that a member of the AG's office is using his position and State time and State resources to review and comment upon private e-mail messages. When questioned on the matter, Mr. Pidot noted that he believed that it was, quote, his responsibility, end quote, to communicate with the e-mail's author on this matter. More appalling is that the Attorney General supported Mr. Pidot's intrusive self-righteousness. So now the AG's office considers monitoring and passing judgment upon private e-mail message as one of its responsibilities. If that's the case, then I ask the Attorney General what policies are in place concerning this new responsibility? Is this service going to be available to all Maine citizens or just to the politically well connected? Will you also review correspondence, editorials, public speeches and cocktail chatter?

Second, Mr. Pidot's comments come from the highest law enforcement authority in our State. Such communication can have a stifling effect on the public debate. They might be considered coercive. Now I know the author of the original email, he's a Professor at the University of Maine at Machias, and he would not be bullied by such comments. But many other

Maine citizens would be and feel intimidated. If indeed there is a criminal act occurring, than I say to the Attorney General's Office, prosecute. But in the absence, spare us the editorial comments, the judgmental inferences and self righteous strutting. You are a law enforcement agency, not the editorial department at Salon Magazine. We do not need the Office of Maine's Attorney General to be our thought police. We do not need public servants and public time commenting on the tone and propriety of private communications. At best, it's a waste of public resources. At worst, it's an abuse of power. Thank you.
