Under Orders of the Day, on motion by Senator **LONGLEY** of Waldo, the following Joint Order: S.P. 143

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Joint Select Committee on Youth at Risk is established as follows.

1. Establishment. The Joint Select Committee on Youth at Risk, referred to in this section as the "committee," is established.

For purposes of this order, "youth at risk" is defined as:

- A. Youth who are without proper care or subsistence, education, a home or medical or other care necessary for well-being or who are in need of mental health services;
- B. Youth who are without or beyond the control of their parents or legal guardians;
- C. Youth who are in foster care;
- D. Youth who are in imminent danger of serious physical, mental or emotional injury; or
- E. Youth who are at risk of prosecution for a juvenile offense.
- 2. Membership. The committee consists of 3 members from the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate and 10 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House. The members must include at least one Senate member and 2 House members from each of the following joint standing committees: the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice, the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The first named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first named House member is the House of Representative's chair.
- 3. Responsibilities. The committee has the following responsibilities:
- A. To review legislation referred to it by the Legislature concurrently with the joint standing committee having jurisdiction over the policy area and, with the approval of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, to report out legislation related to youth at risk;
- B. To analyze the causes contributing to youth at risk and to develop and propose measures to eliminate or reduce the causes contributing to youth at risk; and
- C. To perform other tasks that may be assigned to it by the Legislature or by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House jointly, including issuing reports to the Legislature on policy issues related to youth at risk.
- 4. Meetings; staffing. The committee may meet once per week, on a day determined by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, as necessary to complete its work. The Office of Policy and Legal Analysis and the Office of Fiscal and Program Review shall provide staff assistance to the committee. Clerical assistance must be provided by the Legislative Information Office.

5. Reimbursement. Members of the committee are entitled to per diem and reimbursement of expenses in the same manner as members of joint standing committees.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Waldo, Senator Longley.

Senator LONGLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Very quickly everyone. As you just heard, this is a Joint Order to create a Children At Risk Select Committee. Basically, it's a way of acknowledging that there are kids in Maine who are falling through the cracks and somehow we've got to get our focus on the fact that there are kids who might be a DHS kid who then stumbles into the Department of Education because of developmental delays. The next thing you know, there is Department of Mental Health issues and before we know it, this child, who we've neglected, is a juvenile falling into the Department of Corrections. This is a simple attempt to focus a chosen few of us on the matter of children who have fallen through the cracks, who become our youths at risk. As we learned from the Maine Kids Count vesterday, for the most part Maine's kids are doing really well. But there are pockets and areas where that's not the case at all. So that's the jest of the motion. I request a call of the roll. Thank you.
