- 1. Committee established. The Joint Study Committee to Study the Offset in Social Security and Maine State Retirement System Benefits, referred to in this order as the "committee," is established.
- 2. Membership. The committee consists of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor. The chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor are the chairs of the committee.
- Convening meeting. The chairs of the committee shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee no later than July 15, 2001.
- 4. Duties. The committee shall review the current federal law requiring a reduction in benefits for persons receiving both social security and Maine State Retirement System benefits and determine methods to alleviate the loss of benefits.
- Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee.
- Compensation. Members of the committee are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at authorized meetings of the committee.
- 7. Report. The committee shall report on the issues studied with any recommended legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than January 15, 2002. If the committee requires an extension of time to make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
- 8. Committee budget. The chairs of the committee, with assistance from the committee staff, shall administer the committee's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the committee shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The committee may not incur expenses that would result in the committee's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the committee, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's designee shall provide the committee chairs and staff with a status report on the committee's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

The House considered today a Resolution of Censure (HR 1) of Representative John M. Michael, a copy of which is attached. After a roll call vote of the House, the Resolution was approved by a vote of 137 to 8. Pursuant to House Rule 401, Section 12, Representative Michael requested to be excused from voting, and I granted the request. Following passage of this Resolution, Representative Michael was escorted to the well of the House where I administered the following censure:

Representative John M. Michael, these proceedings are unique. This House for the first time in its history has censured a Member. I call upon the record of Congress of the United States for guidance, and I reference the Congressional Record of January 15, 1868, in which Speaker Colfax quoted May's Treatise on the Law, Privileges, and Usages of Parliament. This text is where we derive the fundamental principles of our parliamentary law. Speaker Colfax quoted from the treatise on a similar occasion of a Member's censure in that Congress:

"It is obviously unbecoming to permit offensive expressions against the character and conduct of Parliament to be used without rebuke; for they are not only a contempt of that high court, but are calculated to degrade the legislature in the estimation of the people. If directed against the other House and passed over without censure, they would appear to implicate one House in discourtesy to the other; if against the House in which the words are spoken, it would be impossible to overlook the disrespect of one of its own Members. Words of this objectionable character are never spoken but in anger; and when called to order the Member must see the error into which he has been misled, and retract or explain his words and make a satisfactory apology. Should he fail to satisfy the House in this manner he will be punished."

So said Speaker Colfax 133 years ago.

The House having voted a censure upon you, I now pronounce the same to be a publicly recorded act and so entered upon the Journal of this House. You will resume your seat. The Sergeant at Arms will escort the Representative from Auburn back to his seat.

Following the official censure of the House, Representative Michael apologized to Senators Pendleton and Douglass, to the people of Maine, and to his constituents in compliance with the Resolution.

I hope that this action by the House and Representative Michael is a satisfactory response to you and the Members of the Senate to the complaint that you filed against Representative Michael.
